

A FREE PARENTING SEMINAR on "Children and Anxiety" is being offered at Newton Christian School 6:30-7:30 p.m. tomorrow. Dr. Joel Ashby, a licensed psychologist at Family Legacy Counseling, will provide practical ideas and parenting tools to guide your child through difficult times and excessive worry.

"HOPE FOR THE HOMELESS" - Area youth are invited to experience a night of homelessness at UP Church on Friday, November 3rd, beginning at 8 p.m. This will be a time of fun, fellowship, and an opportunity to raise awareness about homelessness. This event will take place regardless of the weather! Youth will construct shelters from cardboard (stored in the church basement) and are reminded to dress WARMLY complete with coats, hats, gloves, and bring their own sleeping bags/pillows. Plastic covers and/or tarps and flashlights will be helpful. The parking lot entrances will be CLOSED to vehicles during this event for safety of the youth. The church youth room and basement Sunday School room will be open and supervised for anyone wanting to come out of the cold and sleep indoors. A hot breakfast will be served in the fellowship hall on Saturday morning and the youth will tear down their cardboard structures and be ready to go by 9:30 a.m. Adults are needed to take shifts (around a warm fire pit!) and to keep watch during the night. Please see the sign-up sheet in the fellowship hall. Between now and November 3rd, the youth are collecting warm blankets for local individuals in need. A box is on the stage in the fellowship hall for your donations, which are greatly appreciated.

If you prefer for someone do your shopping and packing, please contact Sue Wolters or Jill Hook, who will take the Kids' Adventures children shopping and help them pack shoeboxes! Collection Sunday is November 12th. Please don't pack items that might melt or leak, or toy guns or military items.

CARPET – The cost for the carpet project will be \$7,250. You have responded with donations to cover more than half the cost (thank you!). Installation is planned for December 4th-5th. Additional donations are much appreciated. If enough is raised to also replace the fellowship hall carpet, we will do that. If enough is not raised for that, a professional cleaning of the fellowship hall may be done, if there is enough to do that. We respectfully ask that donations for the carpet not be at the expense of other programs, as it is important to continue to fund our day-to-day expenses. Thank you. PER CAPITA – The third of four annual per capita apportionment payments was made at the end of September. The 2017 amount is \$40.43/member. United Presbyterian is assessed this amount for each member. The funds are distributed for Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly budgets.
